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Christmas Carol Service

This year we have a traditional Carol service to mark the beginning of Christmas. You may have noted the early date; we didn't want to miss the Banagher College Panto this year so we decided to schedule our Carol service the week before.

We have been practicing for weeks under the guidance of our music teacher Ms Yvonne Barrett. Costume tailoring and fitting is almost complete. 5th class have taken control of the wardrobe department and 6th class have been assisting with the music and lighting. The pupils of Ms Kearns' classroom will be in costume. All the rest of the school will be in uniform. 2nd to 6th class can wear plain Santa hots.
