The Grumpy Sheep

This year we will present "The Grumpy Sheep" on Thursday 12th December at 7pm in Eyrecourt Church. We have been very busy practicing and hope to be well prepared so we can go to the Banagher Pantomime on Wednesday 11th.

Ms McGrath's pupils are the main actors and will all be in costume. 2nd -6th class are narrating, singing, playing music and helping with the little actors. 2nd -6th class will be in their school uniform.

- The Grumpy sheep starts at 7pm and we ask parents to have their child in the church by 6:50pm
- The children know where to sit. Take their coats, gloves and scarves for them.
- The performance will be videoed and a copy of it will be available to purchase for €5 the week before the holidays. If any parent prefers their child not to be videoed please inform the school asap.
- The children have practiced and prepared for the night and we ask that the audience stay in their seats, and be aware of other audience members and not obstruct their view. We are requesting the audience to sit in the main aisle of the church.
- We also ask that there would be no photography or any video taken on phones during the performance as it is very distracting for the young actors. There is also the issue of consent if photos or videos are shared online. Please be aware of this.
- At the end of the play we will pause before the final carols and parents can take photos then if they wish.
- We invite you, our audience to sit back, relax and enjoy the performance.

Banagher Panto

This year Banagher College present the pantomime Robin Hood. All primary schools are invited to a matinee of the performance on the Wednesday and hopefully we will have the Grumpy Sheep well practiced at that stage so we can attend.

We will be taking all classes by bus to the panto and ask that parents send in €3 to help cover the cost of the bus.

Safety Before and After School

With the darker mornings and evenings, please note:

- School doors open at 9:20am. Your child is under their parents care until then.
- If cycling to school, helmet and reflective gear is mandatory.
- If your child is walking to school, reflective gear is mandatory. If they are not with an adult make sure they know and respect the rules of the road and the safe cross code.
- At 3pm parents need to be very vigilant for children when driving around the school. The school rule is that children wait inside the gate until they see their car and then walk to their car. Parents need to remind their children to walk to the car and take care crossing the road. Parents need to meet younger children at the gate.
- The front of the school must be kept clear at all times for bus and disabled access.
