Swimming

It was decided in 2012 by the Board of Management that swimming money would have to be paid upfront in full. The school has a group rate agreed with the bus company and the swimming pool. If children are absent the same amount has to be paid. Therefore paying upfront would ensure the school has covered all costs. (Note in 2011 the cost per child was \leqslant 8) While the pool fees have remained the same this year, bus fees have increased. We have had to increase the cost of swimming by \leqslant 1 per child. (Last year's fees were \leqslant 35)

- The cost of swimming for 6 weeks is €36 per child. If a pupil wishes to pay week by week it is €8.
- Swimming commences this Monday 22nd January @ 1pm in Birr Swimming Pool for 6 sessions.
- Classes 1st to 6th will attend.
- Check that your child has all their gear: swimming togs that fit, hat, goggles, towel.
- Ensure all your child's clothes are labelled.
- Children will travel to and from the pool by bus with their class.
- In preparation, children should practice changing themselves at home after baths/showers. The children change in cubicles with a partner. If possible children should wear their togs under their school tracksuit to

Internet / Phone Safety

Santa was very generous again this year and there is a lot of talk around the school about new phones, tablets, ipods, ipads, laptops and gaming consoles....to name but a few!

As part of our SPHE curriculum we teach about internet safety and personal protection online. We use www.webwise.ie as a resource along with the Stay Safe programme and other SPHE books.

Mobile phones or any interactive devices are still not allowed in our primary school. However sometimes activity outside of school can impact on relationships in school. Parents should educate themselves on all interactions their children are using on phones, tablets etc. <u>Snapchat, Facebook, Whatsapp, Instagram</u> are the main buzzwords we are hearing in school. Pupils are in "groups" on these applications and have no control on the membership. This is where a lot of online bullying takes place by messages sent or exclusion from groups.

We would ask that parents would monitor their children's use of phones etc. We would ask that children do not have phones/tablets/laptops in their bedroom at night or at all in their bedrooms, as we would like our pupils to be as fresh as possible in school!

www.webwise.ie has many supportive documents for parents. It explains Snapchat and other commonly used applications. It gives tips on how to keep your child safe online and how to protect privacy online. In primary school we encourage the children to wait until they go to secondary school before joining Snapchat or even having a phone. We encourage the children to interact face to face, play outside and have real relationships. When they split into different secondary schools or friends move away, these applications are all valuable methods of keeping up contact with their friends.
