

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School Reports



School reports should reach all homes by Friday. I have included the illustration above to reassure and reiterate what the STen actually means. While we are always trying to get a 10/10 in a spelling test or other class tests, this is extremely rare in standarised testing. Only 2% or 2 children out of every 100 children can achieve a STen of 10. A STen of 5 or 6 is "Average" and is where most of the population is at. Any score above "Average" is a bonus but parents need to realise that a STen of 5 or 6 is perfectly OK.

We use these tests as teachers to check that each pupil is progressing at their pace. We would hope that pupils <u>maintain</u> the same STen from year to year and any improvement on their STen is an added bonus but not expected as the STen result reflects their ability.

We monitor the results and if a child is dropping we would look to see the reasons for this and investigate what support is needed to support the child.

We also test 2nd and 5th class in November on the NRIT (Non Reading Intelligence Test). We put this result against their Drumcondra reading and both STens should be similar. Comparing these helps us identify children who might have reading difficulties or dyslexia. We also use these results to plan for the coming year and prioritise pupils or groups who need extra support.

With your childs' report you have received their booklist for the coming year. As you know we purchase all the books and stationary for the year and the only purchases parents have to make are lunch box, schoolbag and pencils/pens.
