Internet Safety

In the February newsletter we had details about Safer Internet Day and the activities we undertook. We were since awarded with the overall prize for Safer Internet Day. This competition was run between primary and secondary schools with 75,000 pupils taking part.

Our posters are still on display at the front door and ask your child about what they know about internet safety.

<u>www.webwise.ie</u> has very supportive and usable guidelines for parents in relation to screen-time and internet use for children. It also has fact sheets and info on all the latest apps and websites.

Stay Safe Programme

This term, all classes are completing the Stay Safe Programme. It is taught every second year in our school.

The CAPP programme (Stay Safe) is a primary school based approach to the prevention of child abuse. The aim of the programme is to reduce vulnerability to child abuse and bullying through the provision of a personal safety education programme for children at primary school level, continuing professional development for teachers, training for Boards of Management and information sessions for parents.

The Stay Safe programme itself is a personal safety skills programme designed for use with primary school children from Junior Infants through to 6th class. The programme seeks to enhance children's self-protective skills by participation in lessons on safe and unsafe situations, bullying, inappropriate touch, secrets, telling and stranger danger.

The programme aims to give children the skills necessary to enable them to recognise and resist abuse/victimisation and teaches them that they should always tell (an adult that can help) about any situation which they find unsafe, upsetting, threatening, dangerous or abusive. www.staysafe.ie

The programme has been revised and we are teaching the new programme this year. Training was provided for only two members of staff but we are hoping to cluster with other schools to receive more training. You will have some of the worksheets home for homework. There is a strong focus on "stranger danger" and not keeping secrets. Children are taught to always tell if they feel uncomfortable, vulnerable or afraid.
