English Curriculum Follow-Up Inspection

We had an English Curriculum inspection in October 2016. We had three recommendations: Oral Language, Assessment and Special Educational Needs provision.

On April 1st we were informed we would have our follow up inspection on the 3rd. We had the inspector Christina Casserly with us all day, observing a lesson each, talking to the pupils, reading our notes and policies. A draft of the report came to us before the Easter holidays and overall we made good progress on the recommendations. That report will be online and available to view in the next few weeks.

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
